 ☐ Register to Vote (18 years of age or older) All individuals have the legal right to vote at 18 years of age. PA Online Voter Registration: pavoterservices.state.pa.us/Pages/VoterRegistrationApplication.aspx
☐ Register for Selective Service **Age 18**
Male U.S. citizens and male immigrants, 18 through 25 years of age, are required to register with Selective Service. Men with disabilities that would disqualify them from military service still must register with Selective Service. Selective Service does not presently have authority to classify men, so even men with obvious handicaps must register now and, if needed, classifications would be determined later. • Selective Service System: sss.gov
☐ Apply for Medical Assistance/ACCESS

 □ Apply for Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) pays benefits to disabled dependents of a parent who collects Social Security benefits or dies, so long as the individual became disabled before they reached 22 years of age. Supplemental Security Income (SSI) pays benefits to people whose disabilities prevent gainful employment, provided countable resources are less than \$2,000 and monthly income is less than approximately \$850. ■ Social Security Income: ssa.gov/ssi 800-772-121 ■ Social Security Disability Insurance: ssa.gov/disability 800-772-1213
☐ Develop Long-Term Financial and Guardianship Plans
The ARC, private attorneys and financial planners have expertise in working with families and individuals with special needs. These professionals may assist with financial decisions, advocacy, guardianship, etc.

☐ Obtain Residential Information

☐ Participate in Vocational and Transition Assessments
Assessments will be provided by professionals in the VTC as well as during career classes and community-based vocational training. These may also be done through the IUs, OVR or other agencies. Career portfolios

will be developed during VTC career classes.
