PLAN of PA Special Needs Trust Administration Services allow for an individual with a lifelong disabilities to set aside funds without impacting their eligibility for government benefits, including SSI and Medicaid. However, there are certain rules around how the trust funds can be spent in order to preserve benefit eligibility. PLAN of PA assists individuals with a Special Need by serving as the Trust Administrator, or fiduciary, of the Trust. We differ from a Trust company or bank in the sense that we engage the beneficiary and his or her support system in annual planning that not only reviews the financial performance of investments, but also assures that the person is utilizing the trust funds to live the most meaningful, happy and healthy life. Our Care Management team partners with the person and his or her support network to assist the person in living a happy, healthy and meaningful life. We focus on the following 6 Core Life areas in order to achieve that goal: Vocational Pursuits, Housing, Financial Stability, Health & Wellness, Attaining Government Benefits, and Social System Development.

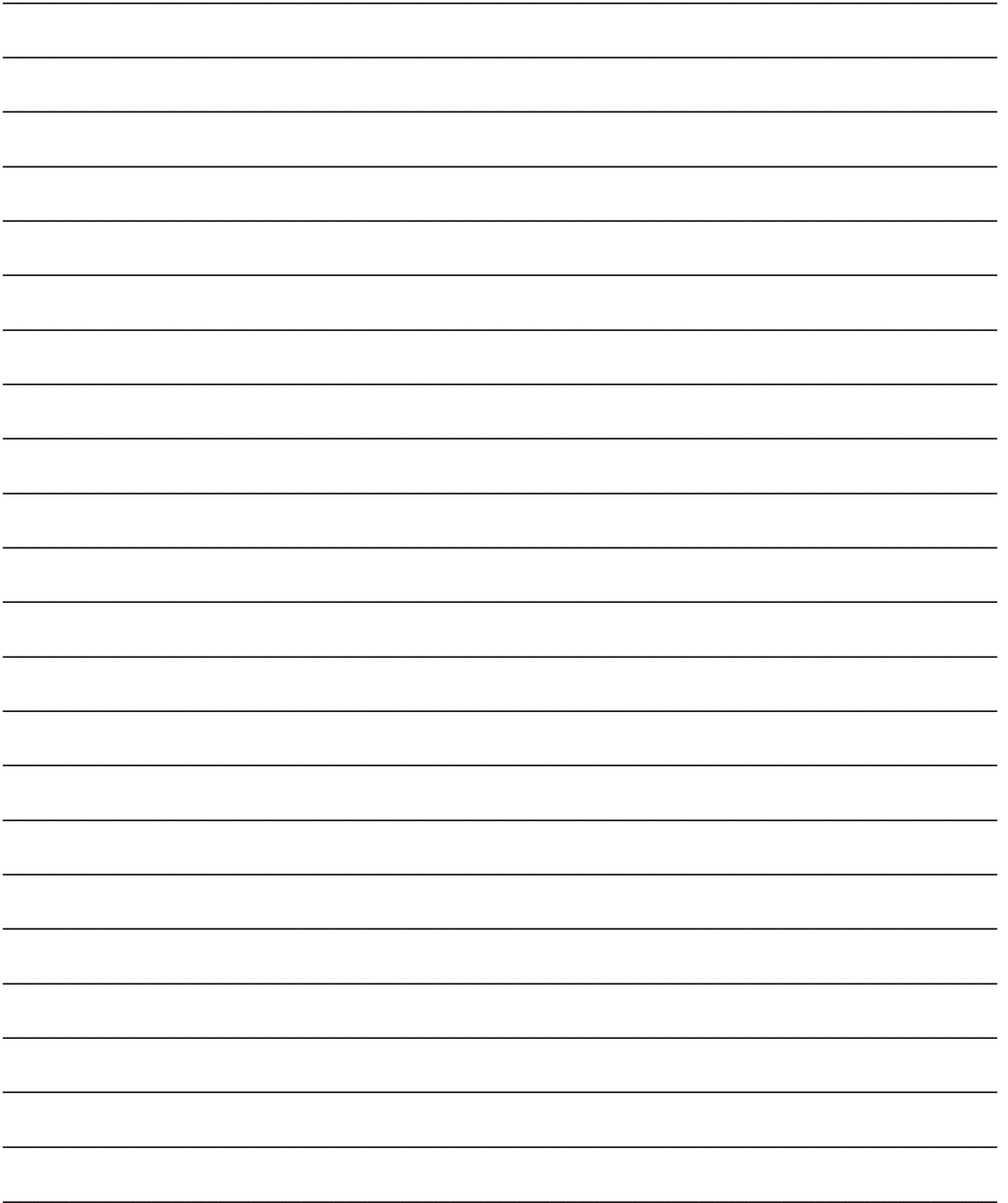

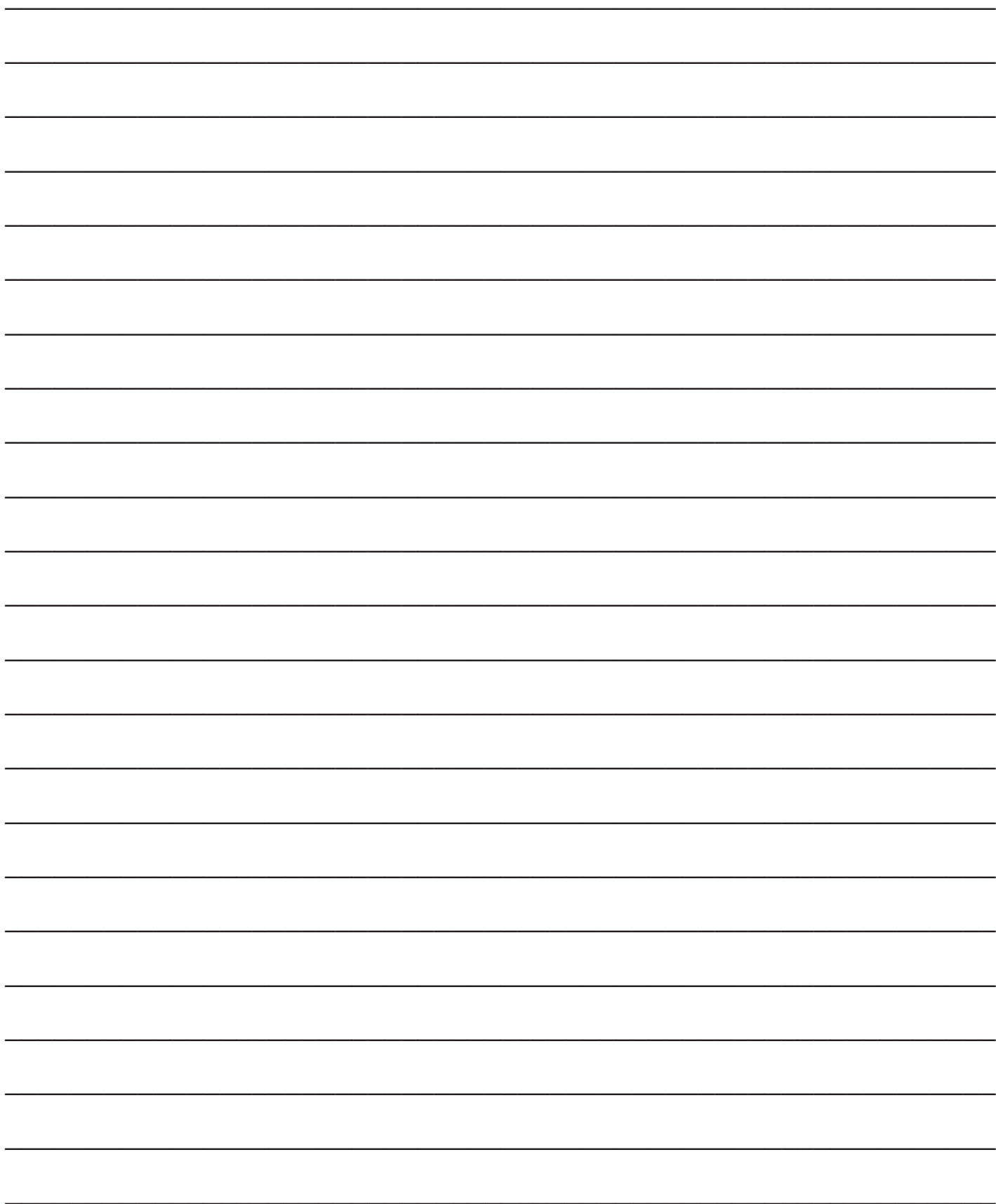
