Frustration Tolerance (Meltdowns & Shutdowns) WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 14, 2018, 6:30-8:00 PM

Frustration. Stress. Distress. Temper. Meltdowns. These are all different exits on the Anger Highway. It's almost impossible for your child to be social or to learn when feeling overwhelmed emotionally. It makes caregivers feel powerless or helpless when we don't know what to do or say to help. Worse yet, if we use the wrong supportive strategy at the wrong time, we may escalate the child and make things worse! With compassion for both child and caregiver, Mike will teach you his unique "Emotional GPS" framework. E-GPS guides both child and you in the use of four different levels of strategies to match four levels of frustration and anger. Learn practical language and strategies to proactively decrease the frequency of overreactions and meltdowns (or prevent them). You will learn simple and memorable cognitive-behavioral language that increases coping and problem-solving skills.

Wrap-around services help families by identifying community-based supports and planning how to best meet the needs of children with emotional and behavioral problems. For families whose child has a diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder, some supports may also be available through specialized Applied Behavioral Analysis providers. Our experts will share strategies for bringing together family members and professionals that are interested in the child's well-being, creating a family support plan based on individual needs, coordinating both natural and professional supports, brainstorming and developing strategies, and accessing and utilizing the community's resources and services.

Presenter: Susannah Horner, LCSW is the Clinic Social Worker for the Center for Autism Research and provides support for the clinicians and families that are involved with the center.
